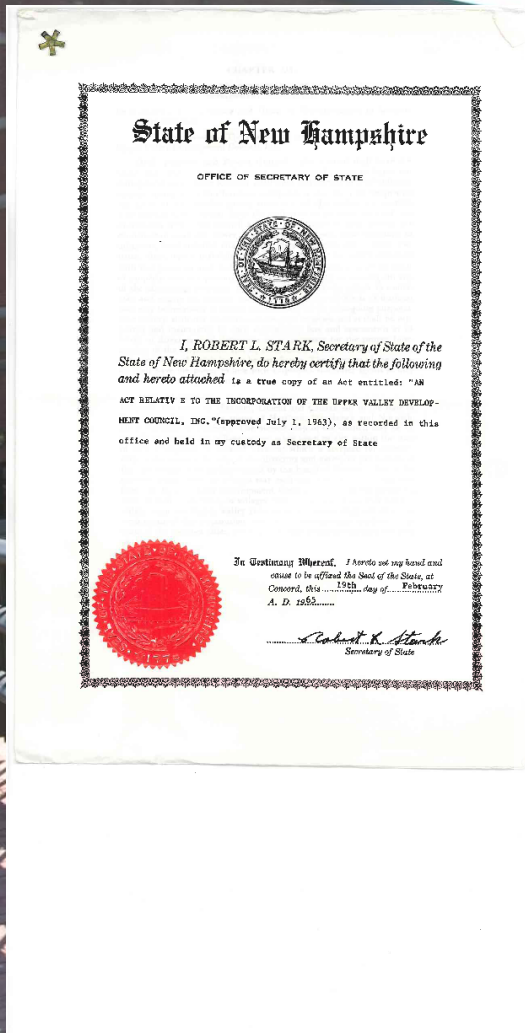

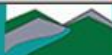


• *Since 1963 the Regional Commission has existed to assist municipalities throughout the region.*

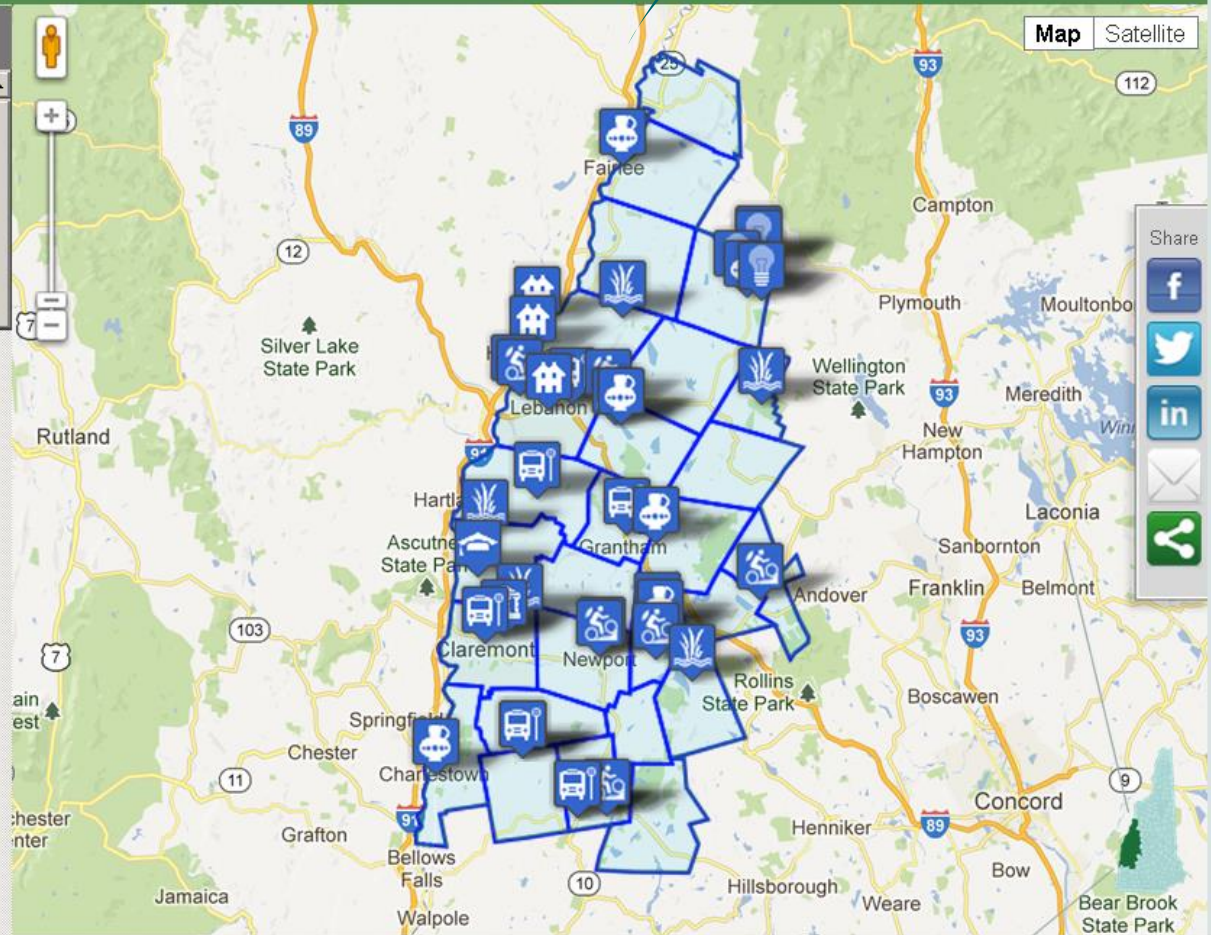

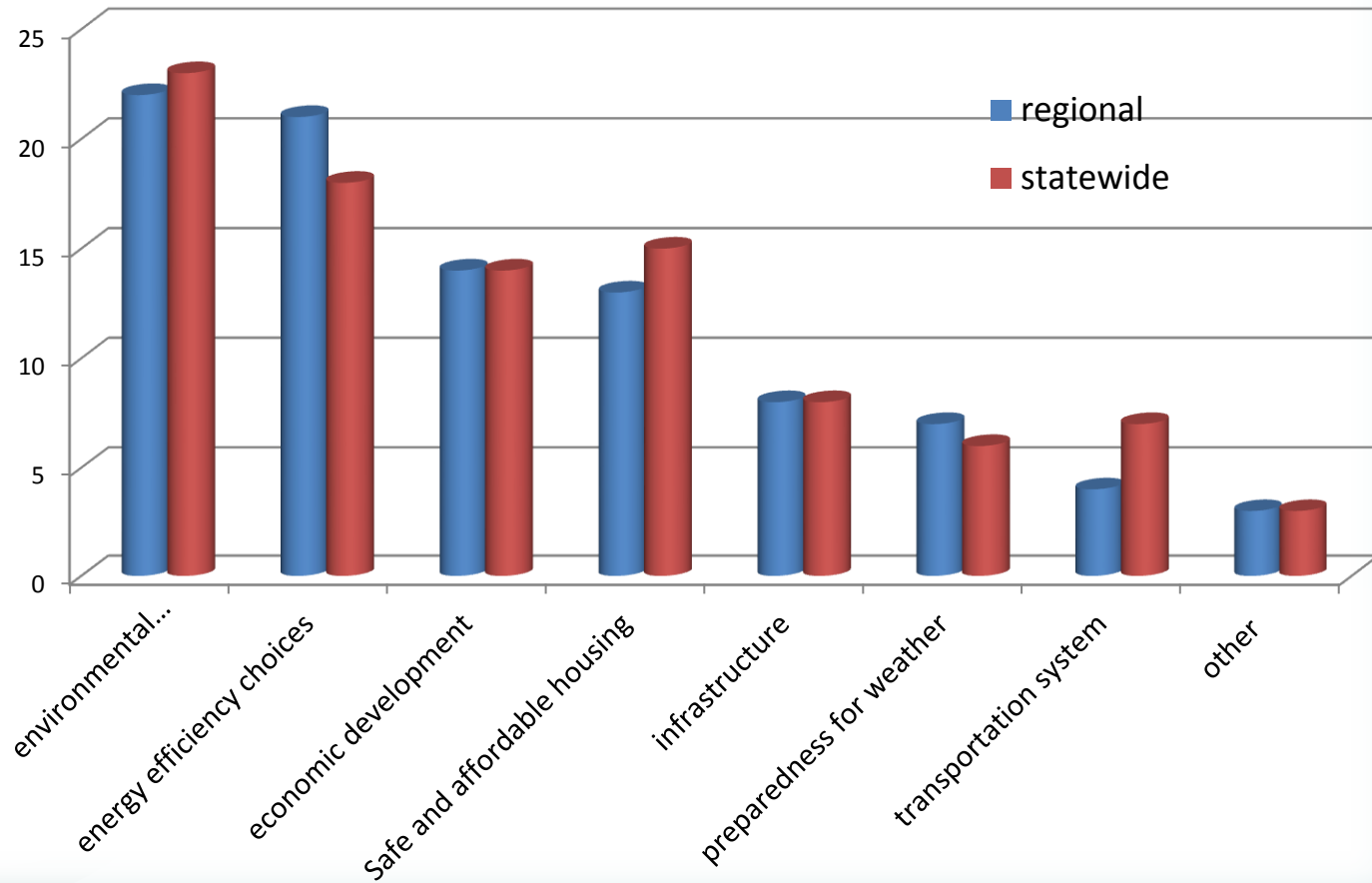
How important is it to have the following in your community?



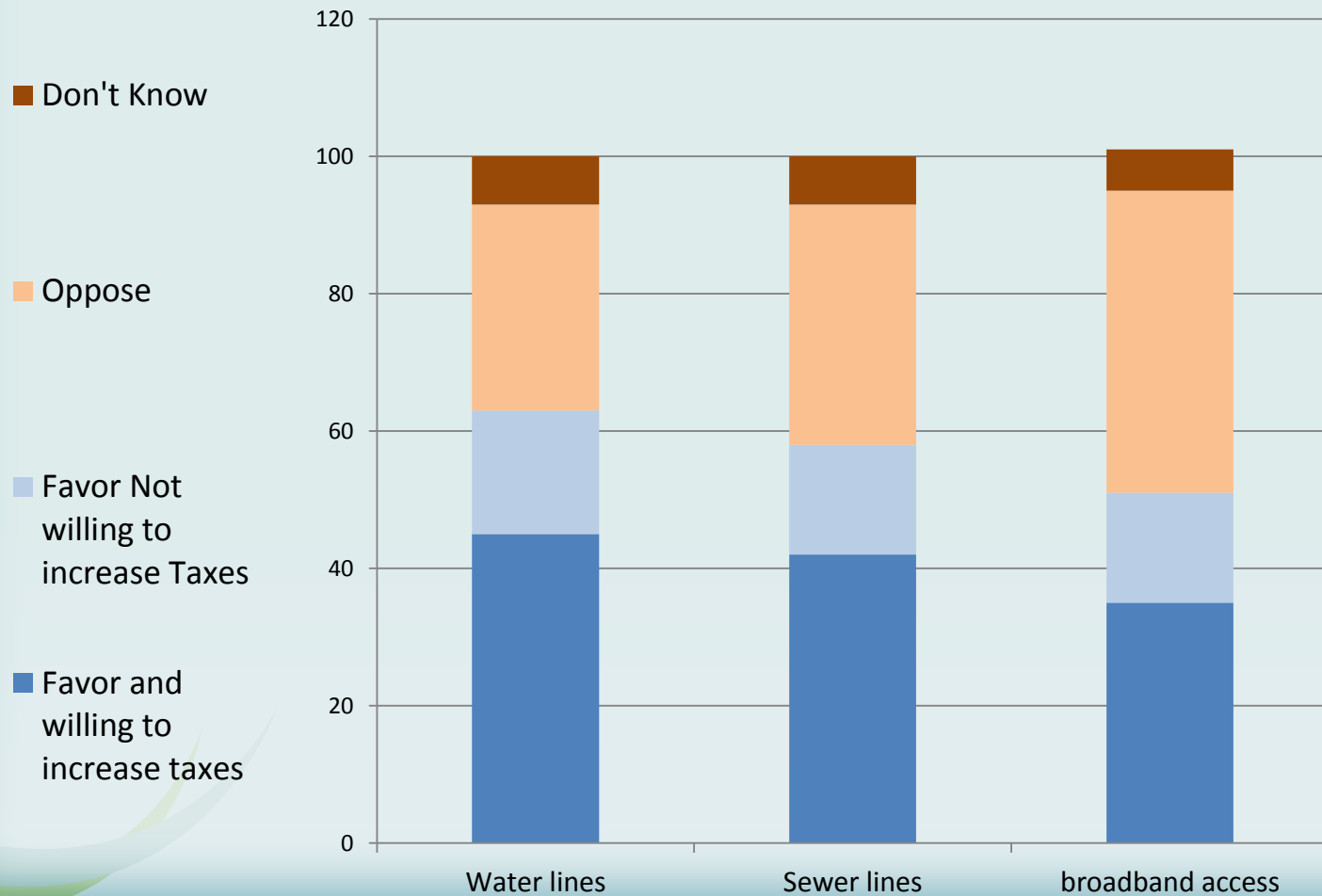
Which of the following things should be actively encouraged in your community?



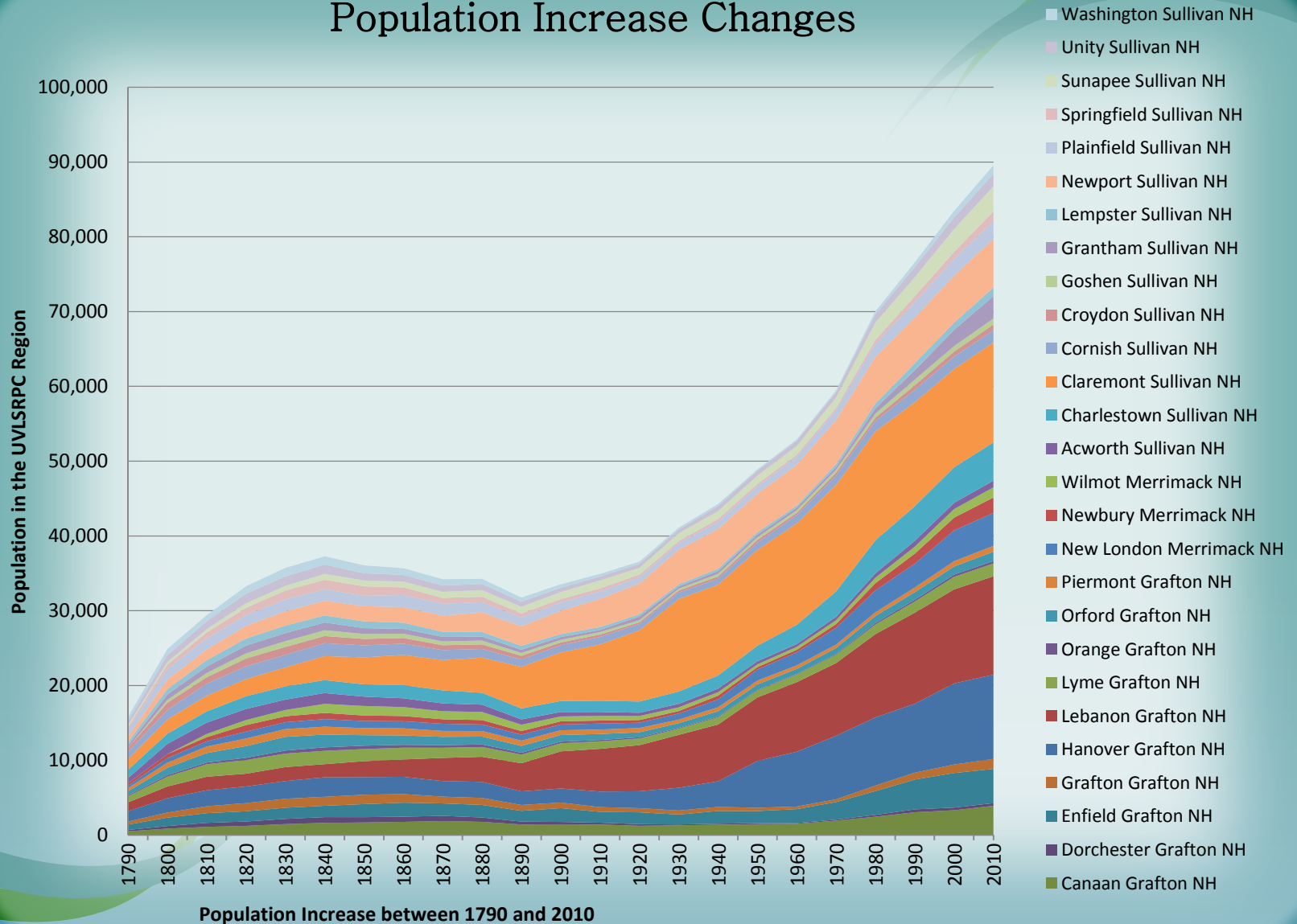
Which of the following do you think should be the TOP priority for investment of public dollars?



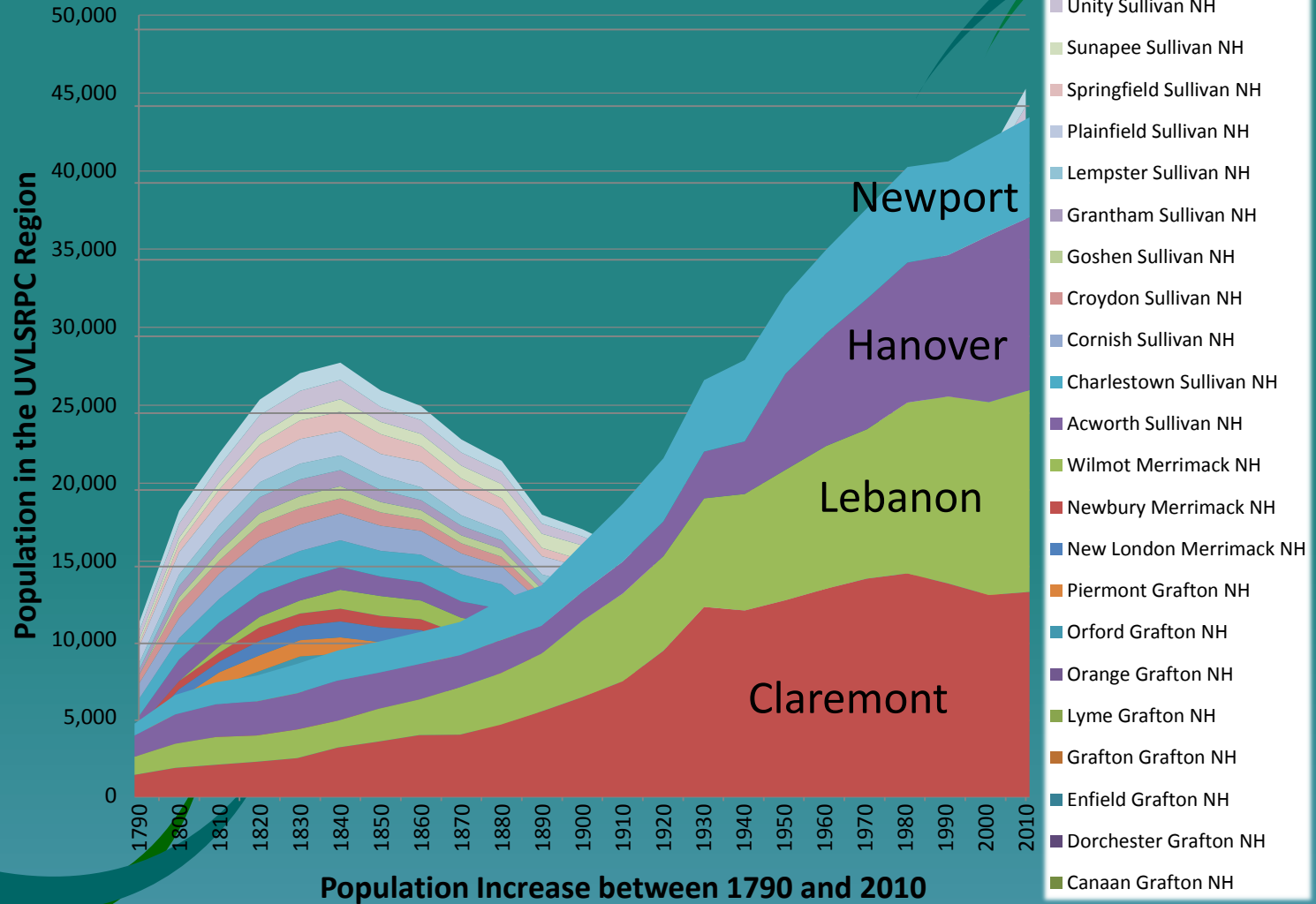
Do you favor or oppose using municipal funds to provide the following utilities to existing and potential development?

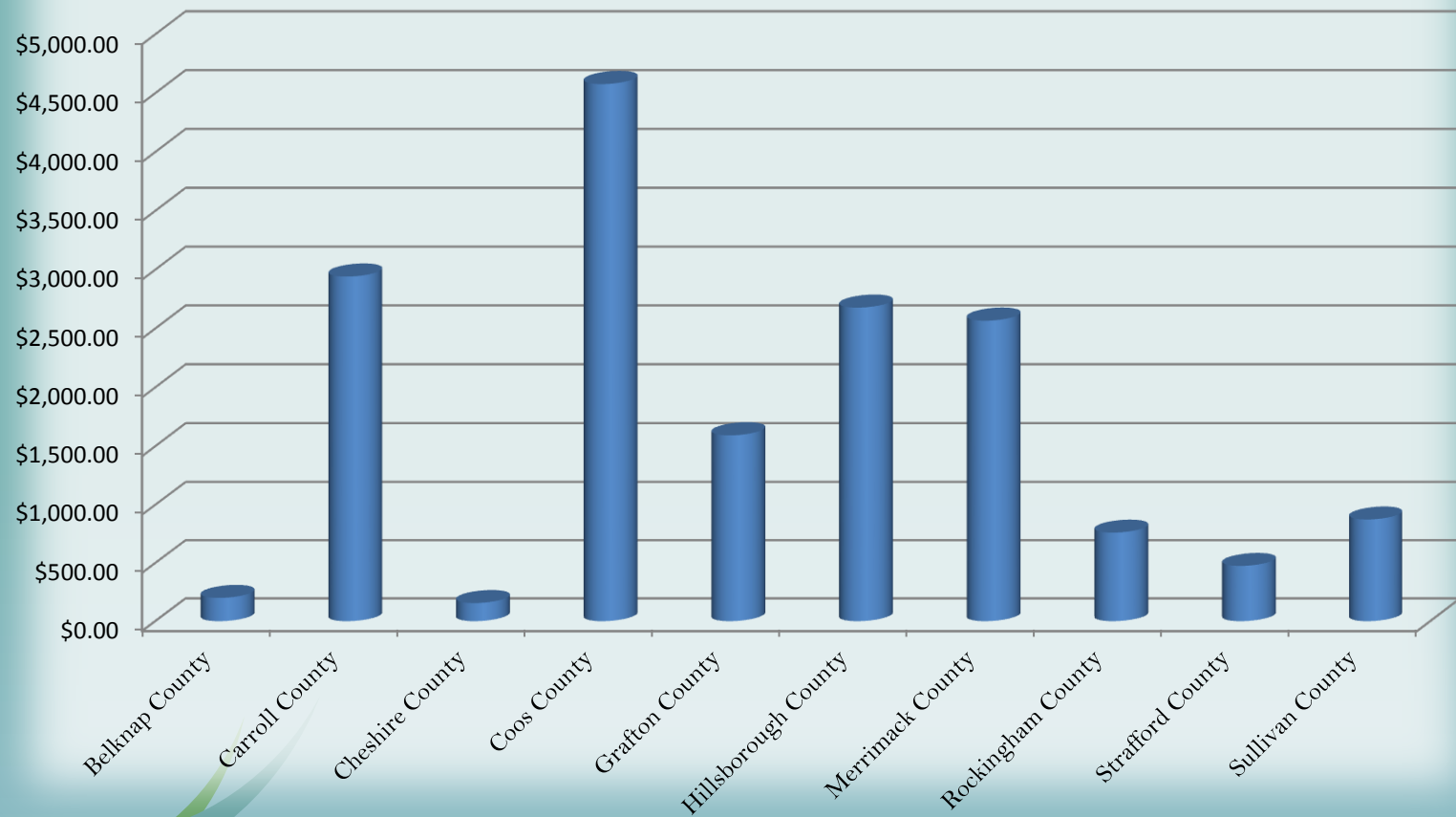

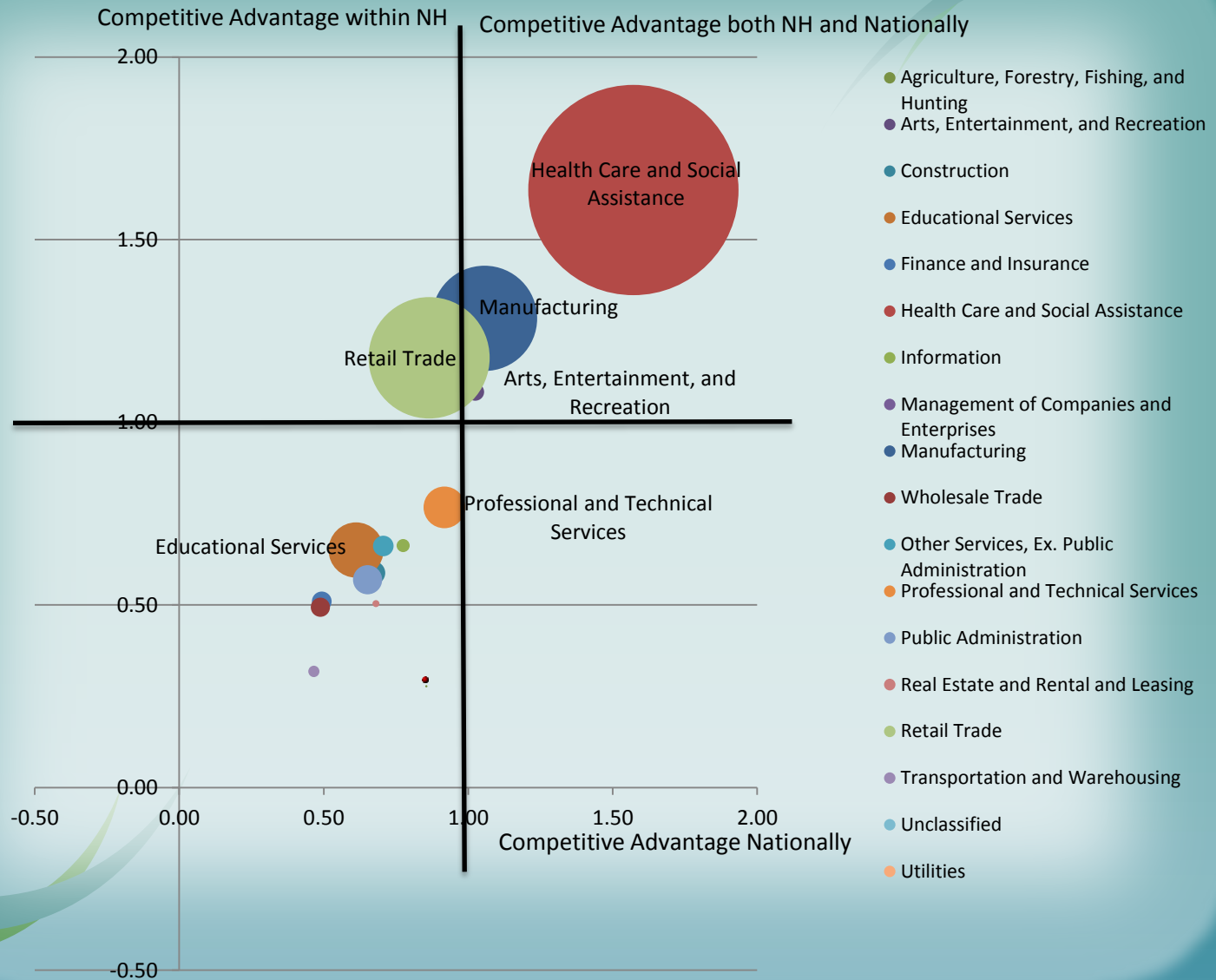
Percent Change in Employment
