Contest Rules and Guidelines

MISSION OF VIDEO CONTEST

Encourage junior high and high school students within the Region to think about what they like about their community or what they think could make their community better and express this in video format. What makes you glad to live where you do? What's special about where you live? Show us in your video and make us like it too. Or what would make your community a better place to live and work? Make us believe it.

PRIZES

First prize is a \$100 iTunes gift certificate Second prize is a \$50 iTunes gift certificate Third prize is a \$25 iTunes gift certificate

DESIGN REQUIREMENTS & SUBMISSION

- Must be suitable for public viewing (no obscene language or content).
- There must be a minimum of 5 teams entering the contest.
- Video submission should not have been viewed or used previously in public.
- Length of video is 3 5 minutes; your beginning credits count towards the total length of the film; the ending credits do not. Official start time will begin after 10 seconds of black, then 5 seconds of "UVLSRPC/Community TV Video Contest 2013."
- No copyrighted music. (See list of resources for available non-copyrighted music.)
- Provide all release forms with submission of video.
- Each finished project must be provided as a Quicktime file.
- Equipment loans and assistance with video editing may be obtained from the CATV by contacting Angelina at 802-295-6688 or Angelina.catv@gmail.com. - Videos shall be delivered to Victoria Davis (<u>vdavis@uvlsrpc.org</u>) via YouSendIt or other file-sharing service or via DVD to UVLSRPC. 10 Water Street, Suite 225, Lebanon, NH 03766.
 Please note that UVLSRPC's email server cannot receive large files directly.

- Videos must be submitted no later than January 31, 2013. Upon submission of your video, send an e-mail to vdavis@uvlsrpc.org with the following information.
 - Full name, mailing address, telephone number, and e-mail address
 - Organization/Club/School (if applicable)
 - Name of your video
 - Names of all participants in the video, as well as those who worked on the video (such as the editor, director, writer, etc.)
 - A transcript of the video in a text doc.
 - A signed release for each person who is involved in, shown, or heard in the video. Submit the releases electronically or fax it to 603-448-0170, attention Victoria Davis. Forms available at www.uvlsrpc.org search "video contest" in projects box.

LEGAL INFORMATION

- When you submit a video, you are expressly stating that the submission is your original work
 and was not created as a work for hire, and you are expressly stating that is has not been
 licensed to any other entity.
- By submitting a video, you are expressly granting the UVLSRPC and community TV stations the right to use your video as they see fit. (You will still be able to use the video yourself.)
- Works submitted in formats which do not conform to the contest guidelines will not be considered eligible for judging.
- All decisions by the UVLSRPC and community TV stations will be considered final.
- The UVLSRPC and the community TV stations are not responsible for lost, late, damaged or never received submissions.
- You must be 18 years or older to submit a video **OR** have written permission from a legal guardian or parent.
- Each entry must be the original work and sole and exclusive property of the person who submits it
- Release Forms must be accompanied with your submission: Video Release for each video and Photo/Image/Voice/Music Release for each video team member and any owner or originator of an materials used within the video including, photos, images, voice, and music.

DECISIONS

- Decisions will be made by the UVLSRPC Outreach Committee and community TV stations, and all decisions will be final. See http://regionalplan.uvlsrpc.org/regional-committees/outreach-committee/ for list of Committee members.
- Videos will be judged on relevance to the mission, originality, content, and production value.

WINNING DESIGN

- The video contest winners will be announced and the video unveiled to the public at a public event. The video will be posted on the UVLSRPC web site and broadcast on the community TV network, and will be shown at community events and public meetings.
- The video contest winner will be featured in a press release.
